# NOVEMBER UMBRELLA WALL HANGING

Please read all instructions carefully before starting the project and make sure you understand each step.

## MATERIALS

- $\frac{5}{8}$  yard assorted white scraps
- $\frac{1}{4}$  yard assorted grey scraps
- $\frac{1}{8}$  yard assorted brown scraps
- $\frac{1}{8}$  yard assorted red scraps
- $\frac{1}{8}$  yard assorted orange scraps
- $\frac{1}{8}$  yard assorted green scraps
- $\frac{1}{8}$  yard assorted blue scraps
- $\frac{1}{8}$  yard assorted purple scraps
- $\frac{1}{8}$  yard assorted yellow scraps
- $\frac{1}{8}$  yard assorted turquoise scraps
- $\frac{3}{8}$  yard dark blue fabric for the binding
- 32" x 33" batting
- 35" x 36" backing fabric
- neutral-colored thread for piecing
- rotary cutter, ruler & mat
- quilting thread
- sewing machine
- general sewing supplies

## FINISHED QUILT SIZE

28  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30"

## NOTE

It is recommended that fabrics be 100% cotton, pre-washed and well ironed. Requirements are based on fabric with a usable width of 40". Seam allowance is  $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Seam allowances are included in the cutting instructions.

## CUTTING

From the white fabric cut

- one hundred and seventy-two 2" squares

From the grey fabric cut

- fifty-five 2" squares

From the brown fabric cut

- nine 2" squares

From the red fabric cut

- twenty 2" squares

From the orange fabric cut

- sixteen 2" squares

From the green fabric cut

- thirty-four 2" squares

From the blue fabric cut

- seventeen 2" squares

From the purple fabric cut

- twenty 2" squares

From the yellow fabric cut

- eighteen 2" squares

From the turquoise fabric cut

- nineteen 2" squares

From the width of the binding fabric cut

- four 2 1/4" strips

## ASSEMBLY

Lay out the squares in twenty rows of nineteen squares each. Make up the horizontal rows by joining the nineteen squares together, following diagram 1. Arrows indicate in which direction seams should be pressed.

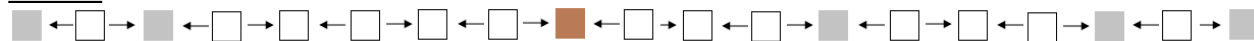
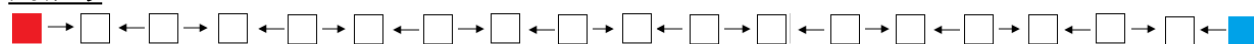

Join the rows together in numerical order, starting with Row 1 at the top, matching the seams at the intersections. Press seams towards rows with even numbers.

Press quilt top well.

QUILTING

Layer the backing right side down with the batting and quilt top right side up on top. Baste the three layers together. Quilt as desired.

BINDING

Join the binding strips into one length using diagonal seams, press the seams open and press the length of binding in half with the wrong sides together. Beginning approximately halfway along one side, join the binding to the front of the quilt with a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam, mitering each corner as you go.

Trim the batting and backing even with the edge of the quilt top. Turn the folded edge of the binding to the back of the quilt and hand-stitch it in place.

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## Layout



Finished square size is  $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " (this does **NOT** include seam allowances!)

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
